1. STATISTICS your special attention is called to Paragraph 176 (1) in the Wesleyan Methodist Discipline: "Each Annual Conference shall require the pastor in charge to report complete accurate statistics according to the blank form provided in the Discipline and no Annual Conference shall have authority to pass the character of any pastor who neglects to perform this service, except by a two-thirds vote, and said vote shall be made a part of the permanent records of the conference."

Each pastor shall pay special attention to notes on the statistical blanks and to the first paragraph in particular.

- 2. NOMINATING COMMITTEE A nominating committee shall be elected including five elders, and five laymen; the chairman of which shall be the Conference President. Members of this committee shall not be from the same church. (Effective 1961). Any vacancies in this committee shall be filled by the committee on vacancies. Any members of this committee who knows he will not be able to serve shall notify the Conference President at least two weeks in advance of Annual Conference session.
- 3. VACATIONS Each pastor shall have a two weeks vacation with pay, or if he desires to hold a two weeks meeting this will be considered in lieu of his vacation. The Conference President shall have a three weeks vacation with pay.
- 4. WESIEYAN METHODIST NAME Any work or worker using the name "Wesleyan Methodist" and desiring to continue affiliation and fellowship with the Florida Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, must have the approval of the Annual Conference or the President and his Advisory Board, before proceed-

ing to work within the boundaries of said conference.

5. BOARD OF CHURCH AND PARSONAGE BUILDING The Trustees of the Florida Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, together with the President of said Conference shall be known as the Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, and as the Deed Examining Committee, and they are hereby empowered to execute all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of like character, when necessary to secure loans for the Florida Conference of the Weslevan Methodist Church of America or to any church within the Conference needing funds to liquidate Conference. church or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (this writing is to become a part of the permanent records of the Trustees) and that this Board is satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is both necessary and desireable.

It shall be the duty of each person charged with the responsibility of negotiating for or handling any deed for the local church or conference properties to submit such deed to this Board for inspection and approval before offering it for registration.

6. DEEDS AND PLANS No new work shall be organized until all involved property is fully deeded to the local and Conference Trustees, or such steps are being taken which has the approval of the Conference President and Trustees.

Any church which engages in a building or remodeling project, or with the purchase of parsonage, church building or lot on which a church or parsonage is to be built, is required to have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, irregardless whether said church shall ask the Annual Conference for financial aid or not.

7. REVOLVING FUND The Conference shall establish a Church Extension Revolving Fund to accept monies as annuities, gifts, special offerings, etc. This to be loaned only to established churches or new works under Conference supervision. The interest schedule paid on annuities shall be as found in Paragraph 383 in the 1959 Wesleyan Methodist Discipline.

The now established Monthly Sunday School Conference Church Extension Offering shall be used in this revolving fund and the Trustees shall set a reasonable rate of interest and a schedule of repayment for such monies at the time of the use of these funds.

- 8. CONFERENCE DATE The date for beginning the Annual Conference shall be the fourth Tuesday in June, subject to change by the President and his Advisory Board.
- 9. FISCAL YEAR The closing date of the fiscal year shall be May 31. The Conference Treasurer's books shall close June 15, and no money or receipts shall be honored after that date. The statistical blanks are to be sent directly to the Conference Treasurer, who in turn shall forward them to the Statistical Chairman.
- 10. NEW BUSINESS The introduction of all new business of such a nature as to require an election must be presented not later than noon of the second day of Conference.
- ll. CONFERENCE PROGRAM The conference program shall be planned a reasonable time in advance of the opening of business. It is recommended that the program be as follows: Monday Evangelistic Service with a minister of the Conference bringing the message.

Tuesday - Educational Service

Wednesday - Denominational representative
Thursday - Missionary service
Friday - Youth service

- 12. PASTOR AND DELEGATE EXPENSE Inasmuch as the pastor and delegates are actually representatives of the local church at the Annual Conference, we recommend the local church pay in advance to the pastor and to the delegates, expense of transportation and meals, with minimum of \$2.50 per day and the lodging free or utilities furnished by the conference.
- 13. EVANGELISM Each of our churches shall release their pastor, if on call and under the direction of the Board of Church Extension and Evangelism, to hold one evangelistic meeting on a new field or in one of the weaker charges, and that the local church continue to pay his salary during his absence.
- 14. CONFERENCE ELECTION The election of Conference officers shall be on the morning of the third day of Conference.
- 15. PRESIDENT'S TRAVEL EXPENSE Each pastor is to take an offering quarterly for the Conference President's travel expense. This is not to apply on budget credit but is to be sent to the Conference Treasurer and receipted to the Conference Work Fund.

He shall be reimbursed for his travel expense at the rate of \$.05 per mile.

- 16. PRESIDENT'S VISITATION The Conference President is to visit the local churches as requested by the local church, by request of his Advisory Board or at his own discretion.
- 17. QUARTERLY BUSINESS MEETINGS Business meetings shall be held as follows: ______

First Quarter - Immediately after Aug. 31 Second Quarter - Immediately after Nov. 30 Third Quarter - Immediately after Feb. 28 Fourth Quarter - Immediately after May 31

- 18. READING OF STANDING RULES All pastors are to read these standing rules to their local churches at the fourth Quarterly Conference Business Meeting.
- 19. IOCAL CHURCH ELECTION The election of the local church shall be held at least fifteen (15) days before the close of the fiscal year. The term of office of these church officers shall begin and expire at dates corresponding to dates of the Annual Conference <u>fiscal</u> year, in accordance with Paragraph 165 (4) of the Wesleyan Methodist Discipline.
- 20. FILLING OF PULPITS Pastors are to fill their pulpits through the Conference session.
- 21. CAMP MEETING COMMITTEE The Conference President shall be chairman ex-officio of the Camp Meeting Committee. The Woman's Missionary Society president and the Wesleyan Youth president shall be members exofficio of the Camp Meeting Committee.
- 22. BOARD OF CHURCH EXTENSION AND EVANGELISM The Board of Church Extension and Evangelism is to be a permanent committee and is to be composed of the Conference President (Chairman ex-officio), Woman's Missionary Society president, and the Board of Conference Trustees.

During the interim of Annual Conference, the Board of Church Extension and Evangelism shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, Conference Church Extension and Church Extension Revolving Fund as it deems best for the interests of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon writ-

ten order signed by the President and at least one half the other members of the Board of Church Extension and Evangelism, or signed by the President in behalf of the said board.

23. REPORT ON CONFERENCE FLOOR In reading the statistical blanks, read only the following items:

II - 1,2,3 III - 1,8,9,10 VIII - Total only IX - Total General Budget As-11, 14 or signed and Raised - Total Conference Budget - 7.8.9 Assigned and Raised IV V - Total Budget Assigned and - all VI - all Raised. VII - Total only X - Total only - Total only XI

24. IOCAL CHURCH OFFERINGS As a protective measure, all local church offerings received shall be counted by the treasurer and at least one steward together. In the absence of a treasurer or a steward, two members shall act.

25. SECRETARY AND TREASURER SERVICES The Conference Treasurer shall be paid \$25.00 and the Conference Secretary \$15.00 per year for their services.

We the Trustees of the Florida Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church submit this report:

June 15, 1959, met at Brooksville where we passed a motion to let the Conference President and Secretary sign necessary papers for the gift of property in Palma Ceia for widening of street. Signed a note in the amount of \$5,876.88 to Foster and Mary Piatt with 3% interest. Signed a note of \$300.00 to Mildred Younger at 5% interest.

July 6, by correspondence signed a note of \$1,200 with 3% interest to Foster and Mary Piatt. (For Orlando land payment.)

July 16, approved a purchase of lots and house for new Seffner, Florida church. Mortgage of \$3,500 to

be assumed by C. H. Martin.

Sept. 22, approved a loan from Andrew Huff for \$3,000.00 at 6% interest. Approved to start as soon as possible a Conference President's home, and to ask the Camp Meeting Committee to secure a caretaker as soon as possible to relieve the president of duties at the Camp Grounds. Approved plans of the St. Petersburg Church expansion work. Also, approved the making of a request to the Conference, asking them to establish a Revolving Fund and that the existing monthly Sunday School offering be placed in this fund. Approved several recommendations which are now a part of the Standing Rules and Resolutions.

Wilbur Coates and Charles Groves, discovering that the Seffner Church was not following the approved plans of church building, drove to Seffner, made corrections as far as possible.

April 16, met to approve the minutes of the past year. Also, acting as Committee on Boundaries, we directed as found in Boundaries Report. See Report No. 9. We asked the Conference President with the pastor and trustees of each local church to come to a more real appraisal of church properties.

Also, we give the further disposition of the Tampa Ida Avenue Church: (Adopted with no dissenting votes as a separate partial report to the Annual Conference) Be IT Resolved that in asmuch as the church at 2107 East Ida Ave. has been organized for over twelve (J2) years, and that the Wesleyan Methodist Church has lent it's influence for receipts of monies which have been invested in the church building at this address, we the Trustees of the Florida Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, do insist that this property be duly deeded jointly to the local trustees and the Conference Trustees. Knowing that personal monies are involved, we are greed that reasonable settlement must be made persons involved, jointly through the local church and their trustees, and the Conference Board Church and Parsonage Building and Location. BE IT FURTHER UNDERSTOOD, that if no reasonable a-greement be reached that the local Church may relocate in concurance with the said Conference Board's approval at that time.
