

STANDING RULES

- No. 1 On Literature: Inasmuch as our denominational literature, because of its loyalty to the doctrines of our Church and because of its position on all questions of reform, is of such a nature as to promote and more fully establish our principles; and inasmuch as we consider it the duty and privilege of pastors and lay members of our denomination to extend its distribution: Therefore be it Resolved, That we as a Conference pledge ourselves to extend our literature as much as possible, that we use our best endeavor to place our lesson helps and papers in all our Sabbath Schools.
- No. 2 Board of Trustees Report for Final Action: Resolved, That all matters involving the expenditure of money to be appropriated from the Conference Treasuries, be referred to the Board of Trustees for their consideration and to be reported back by them to the Conference for final action.
- No. 3 General Conference Delegate: Resolved, That it is the sense of the Lockport Conference that no person should accept the position as delegate to the General Conference unless he expects to be present during the entire session. The President is requested to communicate this resolution to the delegates three weeks before the General Conference begins.
- No. 4 Evangelists' Report: Resolved, That it is the sense of this Conference that all Conference and General Evangelists be requested to report their work and financial receipts to each Annual Conference.
- No. 5 Closing Treasurer's Books: The Conference Treasurer is hereby authorized to close his books two weeks before the Annual Conference convenes, therefore all receipts and monies should be in his hands by that time if credit on Statistical Report is desired.
- No. 6 Temperance, Sabbath Observance, and Public Morals: Resolved, 1. That we are definitely committed to the prohibition of the liquor traffic rather than its regulation. 2. That we hereby affirm our belief and conviction that the Christian Sabbath was appointed as a day of rest and worship and should be so observed with resolute consistency. 3. That we believe that the highest and noblest conception of public morals is to be achieved through the regeneration of individuals rather than through the collective reformation of society. 4. That for the successful maintenance of the positions above indicated we are fully committed to the support of every valid effort for the preservation of our democratic rights of free speech, a free press, and free religion against all encroachments of dictatorial regimentation of thought and action whether in State or Church.
 - No. 7 Reporting Sunday School Statistics. The pastors in reporting

the Sunday School Statistics under item IV shall give actual number of officers, teachers and scholars on lines 2, 3, 4; on line 5 the total number of persons in the school, exclusive of the Cradle Roll and Home Department; on line 9 the sum of lines 5, 7 and 8.

- No. 8 Reading of Reports: Resolved, That in the reading of the Pastor's Statistical Report it is obligatory to read only items 3, 9 and 10.
- No. 9 Adjustment of Pastor's Salary: Resolved, That churches which enter into a financial agreement with the pastor shall when needful, make adjustment of this obligation at each quarterly meeting. A full settlement of the pastor's salary shall be made before the time of the Annual Conference. Any financial agreement on salary entered into by a church and pastor shall not be of force after the end of the Conference year for which it is made, unless it is renewed by the contracting parties.
- No. 10 Delegates' Credentials: It shall be the duty of the pastors to forward to the Conference Secretary not later than one week before the Annual Conference convenes the church (not missionary) delegates' credentials from his charge.
- No. 11 Budget Apportionment: The Budget Committee shall base their apportionment of the budget for Foreign Missions, Home Missions, Education and Hephzibah Orphanage on the rate per member recommended by the Book Committee. The Sunday School budget shall be determined by the number of persons in the Main School, at the rate of five cents a person for Connectional and one cent a person for Conference Sunday School work. The Conference budget shall be sum recommended by the Board of Trustees and approved by the Conference. The budget for Conference Entertainment shall be fifteen cents per member. Each charge may have the number of members under sixteen years of age, and any Elder or Elder's widow who cannot contribute to the budget, deducted from its membership list provided the pastor gives to the Budget Committee the number of such members before the close of the second day of Conference.
- No. 12 Budget Credit: Nothing but cash shall count on the Sunday School, Conference, or Conference Entertainment budgets. Money paid on L. S. U. pledges, or interest paid on Educational Notes and all money paid for current expenses of Houghton College shall count on the Educational budget. Cash and receipts acceptable to the Missionary Boards shall count on Orphanage, Home and Foreign Missionary budgets.
- No. 13 Date of Conference: The Annual Session of the Lockport Conference, Incorporated, shall convene the first Wednesday of May.

JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Wednesday Evening Meeting, April 12, 1939

The Lockport Annual Conference, Incorporated, of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America convened for its Seventy-eighth Annual Session at the East Aurora Wesleyan Methodist Church in East Aurora, N. Y. on April 12, 1939 at 7:00 p. m.

Opening.—The President, Rev. A. J. Taylor, called the Conference to order and after congregational singing Rev. O. G. Wyman led in prayer.

Roll Call.—The roll of Ministers was called and 15 were marked present.

Credentials.—The Committee on Credentials made its report which was adopted as read.

Roll Call.—The roll of Delegates was called and 11 were marked present.

Bar of Conference.—The Bar of Conference was fixed as the first six rows of seats across the front of the church.

Time of Meetings.—The time for opening and closing the meetings of Conference was fixed as follows: Morning meeting opening at 9 a. m., and closing at noon; the afternoon meeting opening at 1:30 and closing by vote of Conference.

Temporary Organization.—The Committee on Temporary Organization made its report which was adopted as read to be amended later. (See Report No. 1.)

Religious Services.—The Committee on Religious Services made a partial report which was adopted as read. (See Report No. 2.)

Order Made.—The election of Conference officials was made an Order of the Day for Friday morning after devotions.

Discussion.—It was voted to discuss the advisability of moving the date of Conference one month forward.

Adjournment.—Adjourned by vote of the Conference.

Thursday Morning Meeting, April 13, 1939

Opening.—The President called the Conference to order and the devotions were conducted by Rev. G. I. Norman.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes were approved as read.

Substitution.—The name of Homer Burgeman was substituted for Myrtle Squires on the List of Delegates.

Report Referred.—The Treasurer of the Board of Trustees made his report which was referred to the Auditing Committee.

Courtesies.—The Committee on Courtesies presented Rev. Mr. Fleury, pastor of the East Aurora Methodist Church.

President's Report.—The Vice-President, G. I. Norman, was called to the Chair and the President made his report, which was considered item by item.

The Item of the Plan of Church Extension was referred to the Board of Trustees for consideration.

The Item of the Purchase of a Gospel Tent was referred to the Board of Trustees for consideration.

The rest of the report was accepted as read and the deficit in the President's expenses was referred to the Board of Trustees. (See Report No. 3.)

Courtesies.—The Committee on Courtesies introduced the Connectional Editor, Rev. I. F. McLeister, to the Conference.

Communications.—Communications were read from Lynford Sicard, C. H. Dow and C. I. Armstrong and their characters were passed.

(C. I. Armstrong reported as follows: 14 meetings held, 209 sermons preached, 10,250 miles traveled, ill for 2½ months causing the cancellation of 5 meetings. Total receipts from all sources, \$1510.00.)

Courtesies.—The Committee on Courtesies introduced Rev. John Mann and Rev. Harry Schoonover to the Conference.

Names Called.—The name of Harry Bullock was called and his character was passed. The Vice-President was called to the Chair and the name of A. J. Taylor was called and his character was passed. The names of David Anderson, E. W. Black, E. L. Elliott and Adrian Everts were called and their characters were passed.

Report Made.—The statistical report of the Fillmore church was read and a communication from George Failing was read and his character was passed.

Names Called.—The names of Maurice A. Gibbs, A. A. Hickok, G. I. Norman were called and their characters were passed.

Adjournment.—Adjourned by limitation of time. Benediction by Rev. George N. Osgood.

Thursday Afternoon Meeting, April 13, 1939

Opening.—The Conference was called to order and the devotions were led by Rev. Gordon Thurber.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes were approved as read.

Substitution.—The name of Rena Mead was substituted for that of Bertha Bartlett on the List of Delegates.

Invitation Accepted.—It was voted to accept the invitation of the Levant Church for the 1940 Conference.

Delegates' Expenses.—The Budget for General Conference Delegates' expenses was referred to the Budget Committee.

Name Called.—The name of Arthur Osgood was called and his character was passed.

Delegate Speaks.—Miss Ethel Fieblekorn, Delegate from Cattaraugus, spoke of the work there.

Recess Voted.—A recess was voted till 3 p. m.

Conference Called to Order.—Following the Communion Service the Conference was called to order.

Sunday School Secretary's Report.—The Sunday School Secretary made his report which was accepted as read. (See Report No. 4.)

Adjournment.—Adjourned by vote of the Conference.

Friday Morning Meeting, April 14, 1939

Opening.—The meeting was called to order by the President and the devotions were led by Rev. Gordon Wolfe.

Reports Passed.—The Committee on Pastoral Relations made its report which was adopted as read. (See Report No. 8.)

Memorial Service.—The Time for the Memorial Service having arrived the meeting was put in charge of Rev. Charles Sicard.

Educational Service.—Following the Memorial Service the Orders of the Day having arrived the meeting was turned over to Dr. Stephen W. Paine for the Educational Address.

Reports Passed.—After the Educational Service the meeting was called to order and the Board of Trustees made their report which was accepted as read with the power to make the necessary additions. (See Report No. 10.)

The Statistical Secretary made his report which was accepted. (See Report No. 11.)

The Report of the Treasurer of the Board of Trustees was accepted as follows: Balance on hand at the Beginning of the Year, \$246.95; Receipts, \$522.50; Total Receipts, \$769.45. Disbursements, \$639.11; Balance on Hand, \$130.34; Total, \$769.45. O. K. by the Auditing Committee and Signed by: N. R. SHAFFER, Treasurer.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Sisters and Brethren of the Lockport Conference, Greetings:

In the gracious providence of God we have finished another year of service in the Master's vineyard, and are permitted under such favorable circumstances to be assembled again in Annual Session. I trust we have come up in the spirit of prayer and expectation that God may so favor us with the overshadowing of His presence that we shall be able to plan and execute great things for the advancement of His kingdom among men.

He has given us a glorious message of full salvation to proclaim, and no age ever needed it more than the present one, but I feel we need to pray with James Montgomery in one of our hymns:

"Give tongues of fire, and hearts of love, To preach the reconciling Word, Give power and unction from above, Where'er the joyful sound is heard."

We feel like praying with another of our hymn writers, Walter H. Talcott:

"Oh, may every soul be filled
With the Holy Ghost today,
He is coming, He is coming,
Oh, prepare, prepare the way!"

Yes, we must prepare the way of the Lord. What great preparations are being made for the coming of their Majesties King George and Queen Elizabeth of Great Britain, to our near neighbors in the Dominion of Canada in only a few weeks now! Let us prepare the way for a gracious visitation of God's Spirit. I believe we may have it.

We have earnestly striven during the past year to faithfully discharge the responsibilities placed upon us at our last Annual Session, and under His blessing and your kind cooperation the work has been a pleasure.

We believe some progress has been made. Revivals have been held on most all of the charges and good reports reach us from all of definite good done. The work of Church Extension has been earnestly pressed in the different districts, through the leadership of the district Chairmen, according to the plan adopted last year, as I believe the reports of the District Chairmen will show. I recommend the continuance of the plan. I would also recommend the purchase of a Gospel Tent or Portable Tabernacle by the Conference, to be used continuously throughout the summer months by the churches in holding meetings on the charges and pushing into new fields where there are no holiness churches. I believe God still blesses gospel tent meetings, and the fact that the devil seems to hate

them so, ought not to frighten us, but rather make us feel like we should push them the harder for that very reason.

April 29, 1938, approved the plan for conducting services in the Chestnut Ridge Church, under the leadership of Mr. Alburton Brundage and a group of local young people there. January 13, 1939, organized a group at McRae Brook, Pa. into a Wesleyan Methodist Mission. March 25, 1939, appointed Rev. Adrian Everts to act as Statistical Secretary, in the absence of Rev. George Failing, who was elected to that office last year. March 20, 1939, appointed Rev. Charles Sicard, Rev. John E. Bruce, and Rev. A. A. Hickok as a Committee on Temporary Organization. March 27, 1939, appointed the Delegate from East Aurora charge, the Delegate from Hess Road charge, and the Delegate from the East Leon charge as lay members of the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

COMMITTEE ON PLAN OF WORK FOR LOCAL SOCIETIES

The Committee on Plan of Work recommends the following:

- 1. Continue the support of our missionary, Price Stark.
- 2. That each Society participate in the celebration of our Fiftieth Anniversary of the opening of our mission field in Africa by appropriating \$10, the amount estimated as necessary to evangelize one of the two thousand villages as yet unopened to the gospel in the Sierra Leone district. That small societies unable to assume the whole amount alone combine and work with each other that every society may have a share in this work.)

3. That each society have a public medical missionary meeting and that the offering taken be used to buy equipment for medical work.

- 4. We recommend that each society observe World's Day of Prayer in February and Self-denial in April. That always special prayer be observed for our missionaries on the fields.
- 5. That we continue to contribute \$6.00 for Home work and \$5.00 for Hephzibah, both to apply on budget. Also the sending of clothing to Mountain Missions and supplies for Foreign work and the observance of Harvest Day with offerings for Houghton College.
- 6. That each society elect a committee of two to visit sick and needy homes in their own community; to pray and try to help in any way they can.
- 7. That each society aim to be 100% according to our standard of efficiency.
- 8. That our societies contribute as they are able to the building of new churches in the Mission Conferences, using Brother Thompson's Extension cards.
- 9. That the program meetings be held at a time when the men of the church can attend, and that our men be invited and urged to take as much part on the programs as the women.
- 10. That each society keep in touch with the Wellsville Mission and at some time during the year send it either a box of clothing, food or money offering.
- 11. That each member of the local society earn during the year an extra dollar to apply on Brother Stark's salary.
