STANDING RULES

- 1. All Trustees of the Oklahoma Conference shall reside within the bounds of the Conference.
- 2. When a pastor provides his own place of residence, all rent from regular parsonage shall be paid to such pastor.
- 3. The treasurers of the various Conference Funds shall close their books on July 15th. Budget receipts received after that time shall not be credited. Money received after that time shall be applied on the next year's business.
- 4. The Conference Trustees shall be the Committee on Church and Parsonage Building and Location.
- 5. The Committee on Religious services shall consist of the Conference President; W. M. S. President; W. Y. President and the Conference President's Advisory Board.
- 6. We recommend that the following order of business be observed in our Annual Conference sessions:

Tuesday, 3:00 p.m.—Conference Convenes Tuesday evening—Conference Sermon Wednesday, 1:30 p.m.—Election of Officers Friday—Reports of Committees Saturday—W. Y. business session

- 7. A Nominating Committee shall be elected composed of three elders, one of which shall be the Conference President as chairman ex-officio; and the Delegate-elect from two churches designated by the annual Conference. Beginning with the 1956 annual conference these churches shall be designated in alphabetical order. This committee shall first examine the credentials of all delegates to the annual Conference. Second, Nominate all session committees, not already provided for, and be prepared to report at the first meeting of Conference.
- 8. The Conference fiscal year shall end on June 30th, and all statistical reports shall be based on monies received up to and including that date. Budget Funds and budget receipts should then be sent immediately to the Conference Treasurer. The treasurer will then send each pastor a statement of total amount credited to his church for budget during the year.
- 9. Two copies of each written report shall be given to the secretary of the Conference. These shall be typewritten and double spaced. Size of paper, 8½ by 11 inches.
- 10. The Conference Treasurer shall be a member of the Finance Committee and an honorary member of the conference body with a right to speak, but not to vote.

11. The annual conference shall elect a Spiritual Life Conference Committee composed of seven members. This Committee shall plan for the coming together of Christian workers of the Oklahoma Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church. This Committee includes the Conference W. M. S. President and the W. Y. President.

Emphasis at the Conference shall be given to spiritual quickening, edifying and fellowship. This committee shall also plan for the coming together of the pastors and their wives, and all interested laymen for a time of prayer and fasting in the interest of the Oklahoma Conforence.

- 12. Conference shall convene annually on the Tuesday following the first Monday of August.
- 13. In case of a change of pastors the out going pastor shall be paid a salary for the two Sundays of Conference and Camp.
- 14. The Conference Treasurer and the Conference Secretary shall be paid twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) annually for their services.
- 15. The Conference Presidents of the W. M. S. and the W. Y. shall serve as members of the Spiritual Life Conference Committee and of the Missionary Board, with five other members.
- 16. The treasurers of the various Conference funds are to bring their account books, receipts, check books, cancelled checks and the latest bank statement to conference, and place these books in the hands of the Auditing Committee on the first day of the Conference session. All financial reports shall be sent to the Chairman of the Auditing Committee as soon as practical after July 15th. See list of Officers for name of Auditing Committee Chairman.
- 17. The Conference body recommends that each pastor be given a two weeks vacation, exclusive of the Conference and Camp session. This vacation is to include two Sundays with pay.
- 18. All monies received for the Conference Enlargement Fund shall be used for new works only in the bounds of the Oklahoma Conference.
- 19. Each Pastor shall send a complete Statistical Report to the Conference treasurer for his signature not later than July 15th, and he in turn will send the completed Statistical Report to the Chairman of the Statistical Committee.
- 20. The Chairman of the Statistical Committee and the Chairman of the Auditing Committee shall be elected a year ahead of Conference and their names included in the Minutes with the Standing Committees.

TRUSTEE'S REPORT

The summary of the action of the Board of Trustees of the Oklahoma Conference is as follows:

August 7, 1954—Motion made and seconded to dispose of Oklahoma City Parsonage for the sum of \$4,500. Motion carried.

August 10, 1954—Motion made that all money from sale of property in Oklahoma City be held in reserve for reopening of that work. That this money be available for loan, returnable on 30 day notice. Motion carried.

December 8, 1954—The Board of Trustees drew up a resolution and authorized the President and Secretary to execute necessary legal instruments for sale of Oklahoma City Church for the amount of \$3,250.

February 14, 1955—Motion made and supported that the Conference president and secretary be authorized to execute legal instruments of conveyance of Parker Property to Tom Nelson of Alva.

Moved and supported that the conference purchase property in Oklahoma City located on the corner of 51st and South May Ave. from Leonard Simpson. The purchase price to be \$5,000. \$2,000 down payment and \$500 each six months on unpaid balance at six percent interest. Moved and supported that the President and Secretary be authorized to complete transaction upon approval of the Home Mission Secretary.

Moved and supported that the Conference President be authorized to purchase the Episcopal Church property located at Third and McGee Streets in Borger, Texas.

Moved and supported that we loan \$250 from the Superannuated Ministers' Fund to the Westside Church in Enid. This loan to be repaid from the Card Call Fund.

Moved and supported that the Enid Westside Church be authorized to raise 50% of the cost of proposed building to be erected on the rear of Church lots. This cost to be approximately \$4000. The building to be used for Pastor's living quarters and added facilities for Church.

Approved loan of \$296. to Rev. Dorr from Student Loan Fund at 6% interest.

March 10, 1955—Moved and supported that the church at Ponca City be granted permission to build church.

Moved and supported to approve the plans of Tulsa Parsonage as of previous action.

May 19, 1955—Moved and carried that the Enid Westside Church be authorized to build addition to church with limit of \$2,300. as total conference obligation and that start of construction be permitted when current payments on loan are up to date.

Moved and supported that the Conference President and Secretary be authorized to increase loan with Liberty Federal Saving and Loan Association to \$20,000; \$2,300 to be applied on Westside Church, \$3,000 on Endowment Fund and the balance on Arthur Stangeland Note.

EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY

The reports for the past year show good signs of progress in behalf of our giving for education. The Churches and pastors are to be commended for their cooperation. There were eleven churches which paid their budgets in full. Total assigned for education was \$1067.50, total raised 1049.92; total given for benevolences \$283.33 making a total of \$1367.49. 6. REPORT OF APPORTIONMENT COMMITTEE

With the consent of the Conference and local W. M. S. Presidents, we recommend dispensing with the Apportionment Report as heretofore submitted. By closely following both the STANDARDS OF EFFICIENCY and PLAN OF WORK, nearly all items required in such report will be found, and those that are not, are listed as Conference Assessments.

PLAN OF WORK

I. Home Work

- 1. We recommend that each local society contribute liberally to the General Home Fund for the support of Special Missions (See Wesleyan Missionary) and church Extension work.
- 2. We recommend that each local society contribute five dollars or more annually for the support of the Hephzibah Orphanage, the same to be applied on budget.
- 3. We recommend the use of designated Thank-offering envelope for Home Missions.
- 4. We recommend that local societies inquire into the needs of the home mission stations and orphanages before sending used clothing, and that no monetary value be placed on same; that such boxes of new merchandise be reported as to monetary value and that the sending society evaluate the same, the voucher evaluation signed by the missionary be forwarded to Conference Women's Missionary Society Treasurer for proper receipting.
- 5. We recommend and urge each local society to respond to the Card Call Plan and thus assist in the extension program of the Church.
- 6. We recommend that each local society plan during the year to bring provisions or cash offering to the annual conference.

II. Foreign Work

We recommend:

- 1. That we co-operate with the Foreign Missionary Department in the support of its entire foreign missionary program.
- 2. That we forward Sunday School charts, cards, and flannel-graph materials to our Missionary Home, 32 Bergen Avenue, Jersey City, New Jersey.

III. Medical Missions

We recommend:

- 1. That our local societies make bandages* and that these be forwarded promptly to the Missionary Home, 32 Bergen Avenue, Jersey City, New Jersey, to await outgoing missionaries, the number of pounds to be reported with no value attached.
- 2. That each local society contribute \$3.00 or more annually to the Medical Student Fund, not to apply on budget.

*Bandages should be 2", 3" or 4" in width, sewn together in 10 yard lengths with flat seams, and rolled firmly into rolls, not to exceed 3" in diameter. Bound squares of blankets are needed in infant care.

IV. Educational

We recommend:

- 1. The cooperation of our local societies in the promotion of the Honorary Enrollment Plan for the Colleges. The monies for this project should be channeled through the Local Conference and General W.M.S. Treasurers.
- 2. The observance of Educational Harvest Day with program and contributions of supplies and cash; all cash to apply on educational budget excepting that applying on special projects presented by college presidents.

V. Literature

We recommend:

- 1. The use of the combination treasurer's blank for the remitting of money by the Local Conference and General Conference Treasurers.
- 2. That a concerted effort be made to increase the subscription list of the Wesleyan Missionary by faithfully securing renewals and new subscriptions to include every home in the church and Sunday School, with January being observed as campaign month.
- 3. That we promote the Mission Study and Reading Course; the use of the Study Book designated each year with Program Calendars and other helps.

VI. Devotional

We recommend:

- 1. That we carefully observe the monthly prayer requests in the Wesleyan Missionary magazine and other special requests as presented.
 - 2. The observance of the Monthly Fast and Prayer Day.
 - 3. That April be designated Self-Denial Month.
- 4. The promotion of a Prayer Partner Circle in each society making use of new prayer partner reminders, and that reports be sent to the General Conference Prayer Partner Secretary before January 1st.
- 5. That stress be placed upon personal evangelism including children, adolescents, the aged, and with special emphasis upon the Jew.

VII. Area Work

- 1. We urge the provision for one Area convention during the Quadrennium.
- 2. We recommend that all home and foreign appeals for special needs be made to the General Executive Board of our

Woman's Missionary Society, and they in turn channel these needs to the Area Chairmen who will present them to the conference presidents in their areas.

We further recommend that the gifts be sent as directed by the Area Chairmen.

We further recommend that the Conference W. M. S. President direct Christmas gifts according to suggestions from Area Chairmen.

VIII. Conference Work

We recommend:

- 1. That at least one workshop for the Y.M.W.B. and Children's Workers be held annually in each conference.
- . 2. That each conference be divided into districts for conventions; the same to be supervised by a district chairman under the direction of the Conference W. M. S. President.
- 3. We recommend the continuance of the mile-of-dimes project, monies from such to be allocated for mission field equipment.

7. STANDARDS OF EFFICIENCY

(A) Local Society

We recommend:

- 1. That the Efficiency Standard be read in the society the first monthly meeting after Conference (5% credit) and that arrangements be made with the pastor for one missionary prayer meeting each month (the third Wednesday), the same to be preceded by fasting, and at which time an offering is taken. (5% credit).
- 2. That a minimum of 10 meetings be held during the year at which time prayer requests are presented and remembered and business transacted (5% credit) and at least one public meeting (5% credit) at which time an offering is taken for missions.
- 3. The formation of one or more Prayer Partner Circles in each society with a Prayer Partner Secretary, who shall report the names of same to Conference Prayer Partner Secretary within 60 days after the sitting of Annual Conference.
- 4. That the President, Secretary, Treasurer, and the equivalent of 75% of the active membership be subscribers to THE WESLEYAN MISSIONARY.
- 5. That a Solicitor be elected for THE WESLEYAN MISSION-ARY gaining not less than two subscriptions a year.
- 6. That a delegate be elected to the Annual Conference Woman's Missionary Society, and that she be instructed by local society regarding the amount to be pledged by that society at the Annual Conference session (5% credit) and that the President attend the Annual Conference session. (5% credit)

- 7. That the dues \$1.00 per member be sent directly to the Conference Treasurer, 50c of which shall be divided by her as specified, equally between Home and Foreign, and applied on budget, (5% credit), and that all monies and vouchers be sent to the Conference treasurer at least quarterly, (5% credit).
- 8. That we secure every woman in the church as a member of the Society, or achieve a 10% gain in total membership.
- 9. That each local society pay annually an amount equal to 25c per active member to be used as a General Administrative Fund, not to apply on budget.
- 10. That the local Y.M.W.B. Superintendent be seated in the Annual session and be granted the privilege of speaking, and provision be made by her society for such representation. (Ten per cent credit shall be given for each of the above items, and all societies making a grade of 80% shall be placed on the Honor Roll).

Y.M.W.B.

Let us emphasize the work of the Y.M.W.B., and take great care in training our youth by interesting them in mission study. We recommend that each band adopt the Standard of Efficiency.

- 1. Twelve band services in which prayer, God's Word and personal service were stressed. (10%)
 - 2. One public service during the year (10%).
 - 3. Band funds remitted quarterly (10%).
- 4. The use of mite boxes, envelopes, membership cards or some other systematic method for gathering in dues and offerings (10%).
- 5. The Superintendent of the Band be a reader of THE WES-LEYAN MISSIONARY (10%).
 - 6. An increase in membership (5%).
 - 7. An increase in funds raised (5%).
 - 8. An offering for Home Missions (10%).
 - 9. An offering for Education (10%).
- 10. One cent per member sent to the Conference Y.M.W.B. Superintendent as desk fund (10%).
- 11. The annual report sent in on time. (10%). (That is at the time the Conference Superintendent designates).

We, your Apportionment Committee, recommend that each local society observe the following program for the year's work:

SEPTEMBER-OCTOBER Harvest Day and Educational Day (refer to Item 2 under IV Educational PLAN OF WORK). An offering taken equivalent to 50c per member for new parlor furniture in dormitories. Also apportioned one-fourth of local church membership budget at \$3.00 per member.

NOVEMBER Home Missions (Refer to Items 1, 3 and 4 under I Home Work).

DECEMBER White Gifts (Refer to Item 2 under VII Area Work).

JANUARY Wesleyan Missionary (Refer to Item 2 under V Literature).

FEBRUARY World Day of Prayer (offering taken for Wesleyan Commission for Men in Service).

MARCH Jewish work (Offering taken).

APRIL Self-Denial (As designated by General Society).

MAY Offering for Foreign Missions. (Refer to Items 1 and 2 under II Foreign Work).

JUNE Orphanage (Refer to Item 2 under I Home Work).

JULY Medical Student (Refer to Item 2 under III Medical).
